

Get Vaccinated Against Mumps

**Mumps continues to affect orthodox Jewish communities in Brooklyn.
Make sure you have two doses of mumps vaccine.**

- Complications from mumps include meningitis and hearing loss.
- Mumps is spread through coughing and sneezing. To prevent getting or spreading the disease:
 - Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, and put the tissue directly in the garbage.
 - Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or an alcohol-based cleanser.
 - If you are sick, stay home and avoid contact with others.
- Make sure you're fully vaccinated before Pesach and other holidays when people get together in large groups.
- There are outbreaks of mumps in other places, such as Europe and Israel. Make sure you're fully vaccinated before you travel.
